6:10pm	 Executive Board Report Thank you to everyone who came tonight Monster Mash thank you to our co-chairs Tasha and Jessica for an amazing event. The winners of the Fun Run fundraising had their class parties yesterday with the Reptile Man and the PTA hosted a school wide assembly with the Reptile Man since all kiddos did an amazing job and we exceeded our fundraising goal. Movie Night - As we head into the holiday season PTA leadership and the school connected on the idea of doing a winter Movie night, as much as we love these evenings

with the chaos and scheduling of the holidays it isn't possible to pull one off prior to the end of the year. But not to worry! It will come up quick on January 26th and we'd love volunteers to help put the event on. Please come find us if you have an interest and we can provide more details on the updated plan for this year.

- We'll have a few committee updates this evening but first I want to introduce Jeff Chambers and Jeremey Nichols from the district to discuss the school grounds and updates with you all.
- 6:12pm New Business
 - **Special Guest -** Jeff Chambers and Jeremy Nichols with the district to talk through Cedaroak grounds and updates.

District Grounds people will be working on the COP irrigation system. Any spray used on our grounds goes through extensive reviews for safety. We do not use any active ingredients like RoundUp. The only time we use RoundUp is due to poison hemlock and NightShade which are harmful to people and can kill dogs.

COP doesn't have a vole problem, which is great. Weeds help cause voles, which can't be taken care of through poisons, etc. big goal for our field is to get it back to grass and reduce weeds as soon as possible. This is already in the works. If you notice broken heads, let us know, that is helpful. Grass takes time to come back to life. Won't be overnight but will be a big priority. Welcome to these conversations. Boonsferry School is in the worst condition, which is a safety issue. We are trying to address COP before that becomes an issue. Parents take care of beds. When you walk up to the school what do you see? Beds, entry points to the schools, swales (storm water from parts of the building and filters it out before it goes back in the water system) are contracted to take care of these areas by an outside source. Broadleaf spray is taken care of in the spring (it's too cold to do this now). Irrigation is needed for May-September. We are working on irrigation repair now. Late March – mid April is the first broad leaf spray. New seed will be applied and by next fall it should be looking much better. Do not spray on your own – this causes a legal investigation.

Adding a fence guard so that mowing can happen close to the fence, you don't have growth under the fence, and you don't need to spray.

Security update: we are reviewing the security report and district wide upgrade list. Perimeter fencing will find its way on the list. It's cost prohibitive. Fencing and a lot of these updates will need to be a bond project to fund. Your kids truly matter and we value the staff, children and parents.

Basketball hoops: the contractors that we use are working on larger projects. License/bonded/insured contractor just needs to meet with the district prior to being approved to do any work. Matt will call Greg Sams – former student, contractor.

6:30pm Principals Report

Monster Mash was wonderful, calm, and joyful. Hit all the marks. Tasha and Jessica did a great job as co-chairs! (Squirrel Dash prize) Jordan Vickers the reptile man was great. The joyful noise coming out of the auditorium from the reptile man was very exciting. We are in the middle of the literacy renewal process. First meeting was to ground the framework and obligations in the district. Match the needs to the available programs. Four state approved program samples have been ordered for review. 25% of our certified staff are participating, we exceeded our limit! Our teachers are working on impact teams, social/emotional, zones of regulation, reading/writing. We just received first grade classroom book requests for reimbursement. Most reimbursements of higher cost will come through the front office, then reimburse the PTA.

6:35pm Treasurer's Report

- Pass around treasurer report, main change from last month is the costs for Monster Mash.
- We have a healthy bank balance; we need to spend it. Enrichment programs, books, etc. If you want to have a chess club, we need you to help run it as our PTA board is small. Basketball hoops were a great item to add on from last year. Question: Campfire Program could they have access to school related purchases.
- The 3D printer hasn't been submitted yet, but it is budgeted. Personal expenses from monster mash. We got a \$100 check from Dairy Hill as they matched 10% of what was purchased at the monster mash.
- Dairy hill will give \$5 back to every pie sold during a set time to COP.
- Insurance renewal is up for \$600 this is expected and budgeted for already.
- Tara stem expansion for the library. Tax returns have been filed for the annual audit for the PTA.
- OMSI with Bolton! Partner and split cost. \$1875 would be our cost that we would need to
 put up for approval. Thursday, January 25th 6-8pm back to school science night. Caps at
 1100 people we would need an RSVP 550 people to sign up to get access and have a
 check in list. Premium featured events would be included. COP 360 students / Bolton 220
 students. Motion made, all in favor to pass this.
