6:10pm Executive Board Report

Thank you everyone for coming tonight, I know it's a busy month and always appreciate you showing up. This past month there were a lot of great opportunities to connect as a community.

- The Family PJ and Movie night was a great success and always fun to see everyone while watching the secret life of pets
- We completed our third annual library book drive during the "Show the library some love" event

- We donated food to the West Linn Food Pantry
- The new Basketball hoops have officially been installed and everytime I
 go by the school I see kids playing out there at all hours
- Casino night brought together 78 Cedaroak parents and caregivers for a memorable night out
- We showered our classified staff with all kinds of gifts, potluck lunch and love last week
- As a board we did a meeting with all other primary school PTA board members to share ideas and support one another to have a larger impact on the community of West Linn (coordinated food drives, 5th grade social to introduce incoming middle school families together, a shared list of PTA way equipment that we can check out from one another, etc.).

6:15pm District Report on fields and landscape maintenance:

District Safety security supervisor, Jeremy Nichols:

Works on all the environmental, pesticide programs that we strictly adhere to.

Five primary schools that wanted to have weeding parties to forgo the use of pesticides on the school grounds – COPP was one of them. There hasn't been interest from the school community to keep up the weeding on school grounds (flower beds, etc. the field is handled separately). The district is excited to take this back to alleviate some stress on the PTA. Parent Square sends out the memo when pesticides are sprayed. We do this in early spring, the wet time to reduce the amount of spraying needed. The spraying is just talking about the beds, etc. this does not include the field – the district always maintained that. Early May is a good time for 1-2 broad leaf spray then reseed to help get the field back to a better standard. This helps with the fence line (preventing weeds from growing up the fences).

IPM law they adhere to passed in 2012, communicate in advance, post signs, keep records for four years, what approved chemicals (low impact), how much and how often chemicals were used. All details are listed on the district website. Hopefully all this work will help reduce the amount of mud in the rainy season. District is putting extra effort into three fields, and COPP is one of them – thanks to the great communication from the school and PTA (we make a difference!). Irrigation is getting fixed and will be working properly. You should see improvement hopefully by fall you will see mostly grass, and more level out. Owl activity in the owl houses hasn't been seen yet, but we are keeping our fingers crossed. The timing is being discussed, as students will have to stay off the sections being seeded in the beginning.

The Equity leadership team wants to do a cultural event, in exchange for the Earth Art Fair. Meg passed along the DRAFT flier for the PTA to review. The event will take place on Thursday April 25th 5:30-7. Families are invited to share their culture in the gym and if the gym gets too full we will spill into the library. A trifold can be picked up at school to display what you want to share. Food can be shared because it's an after-hours event and students will be with their parents. Language specialist has created a slideshow for parents to see what happens in classes. People will be able to ask questions of those sharing and those attending can ask questions back to those attending; it's a great way to learn about each other's cultures. PTA bought additional trifolds to assist the school. Some ideas could be sharing or teaching a dance, bringing a musical instrument, sharing a favorite food. Ms. Chang will reach out to those interested in space planning. Final flyer will go out soon with QR code. We need parent volunteers to help manage the event.

Indian food and pho has been added to the menu recently, which has been another great way to help expand the world experience.

HMH will be the language arts curriculum the district has chosen. You Fly will also be layered into the curriculum. LO has been using HMH for a year or two and will help advise the committee which materials are most important to purchase.

6:40pm Treasurer's Report

We spent money at casino night. The final amount is still being calculated. Specialist received their funds. 59k is the current bank account balance. 4k from the auction funds was spent by 3rd grade and kindergarten. Mrs. Boyer sent a very nice handwritten thank you note about how much the third grade children enjoyed the new books bought by the PTA. Remind teachers to spend the money they have been allotted. The budget closes when the doors lock in summer!

Casino Night Updates: Thank you Matt Dewolf for a great evening for the COP community. Matt Dewolf said the event was a great success with the only issue being the bar set up and the confusion around how people could pay for drinks. He will work with Communications to draft an email to attendees asking for a donation to help pay for the tab. We aren't going to reconcile with each person, but do have a big bar tab. The purpose was to socialize, and parents gave great feedback that they had so much fun meeting parents and PTA members while having an activity. Ideas for next year's auction are already being discussed with one concept being a Derby themed event, with fundraising horse betting as an activity put on through the same company that we used for casino gaming.
